- B. Approval of the Agenda: Motion to approve by Debbie Mc Cormick. Terry Baxter seconded the motion. Unanimous vote, Motion carried.
- C. Approval of Minutes from the September 21, 2021. Meeting minutes were distributed via email. Motion to approve by Joan Jayne. Seconded by Don Oltz. Vote was unanimous. Motion carried.
- D. Public to be Heard: none heard
- E. Director's Summary- Adam Effler (distributed for review prior to meeting): Dr. Effler reiterated the salient points.

Harmful Algal Blooms (HABs)

- City has reduced treatment of HABs in the water treatment plant. Please visit NYHABS, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's (NYSDEC's) online tracking and notification website, for mapping and information related to HABs conditions for Owasco Lake.
- OLWMC staff are finalizing their move to a unified commercial office space located at 6073 West Lake Road (Fleming), Auburn, NY 13021. The City of Auburn and Town of Owasco have generously provided the use of some of their office furniture and equipment at the new location.
 - According to the original Three-Party Agreement between the City of Auburn, Town of Owasco, and Cayuga County pertaining to the development of the OLWMC, Cayuga County committed to providing office space to program staff. Accordingly, a letter prepared September 29, 2021, requests that Cayuga County consider the provision of OLWMC staff office space as part of their 2022 budget year. The letter will be shared with the Cayuga County Planning Oversight Committee in October.
 - Watershed Inspector, Dillon Shults, has taken a new job with the Tompkins County HealthDepartment. We are recruiting a Watershed Inspector. Please direct candidate recommendations to, or request a position job description from, OLWMC Executive Director, Adam Effler.
 - This fall, OLWMC staff will assist the Tompkins County Soil and Water Conservation District with sediment sock installations along exposed ditches in Tompkins County.
 - On September 27, 2021, a public meeting was held to provide an update on the process to incorporate the EPA Nine Key Elements into the Owasco Lake Watershed Management and Waterfront Revitalization Plan. The public was able to review and comment on the Watershed Management Recommendations.
 - OLWMC staff and project partners finalized project-specific signage that was installed, with the assistance of the Scipio Highway Department, along a roadside ditch on Hicks Road, Scipio October 12, 2021. The sign spotlights the installation of concrete sediment traps installed by the Cayuga County Soil and Water Conservation District (CCSWCD) and funded by NYS and the Owasco Watershed Lake Association (OWLA).
 - The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation and The Nature Conservancy (TNC) have announced the acquisition of 161 acres in the town of Sempronius in the Owasco Lake watershed.

The OLWMC partnered with Wegmans Food Stores on a LED Flares Promotional programunderway throughout the Finger Lakes Region. A portion of the sales of LED flares at Wegmans stores through the duration of the project period was donated to the identified watershed steward organization with jurisdiction. Wegmans included an additional donation of \$1000 to each organization to support efforts for Finger Lakes watershed protection. Wegmans will be donating \$1095 to the OLWMC this fall.

- Conservation Kick Program. OLWMC staff have helped guide progress for this project, and the City of Auburn has invested the required cost share for the grant award. Project funding will meet the implementation costs of installing a water and sediment control basin (WASCOB) on a selected watershed producer's property.
- The OLWMC will resubmit a project proposal through the Natural Resource Conservation Service's (NRCS's) Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) to drive federal funding towards our efforts to advance watershed farm planning for improved soil health and conservation. Representatives from the American Water Works Association (AWWA) will offer proposal preparation support again.

Projects, Planning, and Programming

The OLWMC is finalizing plans for a collaborative rain garden installation project at Emerson Park to be held October 23, 2021,

at 9AM. The planting event is poised to attract community involvement and volunteerism for beautifying Emerson Park and will demonstrate a recommended practice for capturing runoff and settling sediments. All are welcome.

- F. Board of Directors/Municipality Representatives Feedback: OLWMC holds monthly watershed inspection meetings. We will continue to encourage planning boards to include watershed inspectors on issues that impact the watershed.

- H. Hyfi Watershed Water Level Sensors, Project Update- Brandon Wong CEO. Hyfi Group presented the development of the Hyfi project. - J. NYSDEC Hub Updates- Tony Prestigiacomo has a meeting conflict. Same update as last month. Small working group stretched over Finger lakes
- K. Watershed Rules and Regulations Revisions Updates Steve Lynch no new updates and unable to attend.
- L. Nine Element Watershed Plan Updates—Michele Wunderlich shared results of updates. Meeting with DEC and will be making public meeting available online to the public. If anyone has suggestions, please share them.

- N. Owasco Watershed Lake Association Updates Dana Hall is unavailable. OLWA is finishing up treating 1500 Hemlock Trees for Wooly Adelgid infected trees making it 4,000 trees treated this year. OLWA received US Forest Service grant for \$140,000 for insect mitigation which will take them through 2024 for tree treatment.

 - Workshop on 10/26 for leasing land for solar power Farmers needing more information for land leasing for solar development.
